At school we are continuing to make reading a priority. However, a huge factor in children making progress involves reading at home – be that in practising reading scheme books or simply reading and listening to books for enjoyment. The school expectation is that your child will aim to read at home **at least 3 times per week** and that this will be recorded on the GoRead app (if you are unable to access this, speak to your child's class teacher). Our older pupils are able to log this reading themselves through the pupil section of the app. Thank you.

Year 6 will be completing their SATs during the week commencing 9th May. It is extremely important that children attend school every day and arrive on time during that week. To support their learning in school, many children have been given the opportunity to attend boosters.

As a year group, we are working on key skills that will support children during their SATs and beyond. At home, families can support children by reading at least three times a week and ensuring times table knowledge is secure. We will soon be sending home revision guides and a revision timetable, which will allow you to support your child's learning at home. Please speak to your child's class teacher if you need any support.

Anti-bullying Ambassadors

We are proud to have 21 children from Years 5 and 6 who successfully applied to Anti-bullying Ambassadors in be school. Our Anti- Bullying Ambassadors are important members of our school community who work hard to ensure our school is a safe and happy place to learn. The Ambassadors meet every half term after school to discuss ways to raise awareness of what bullying is and help other children in the playground to resolve problems and worries. On a daily basis, the Ambassadors organise playground games and support our younger children to take part. This term the Ambassadors will be designing new friendship stops to be erected in the playgrounds to ensure all children have a positive playground experience.
