





### Foundation Stage 2 Newsletter: Autumn 1

Dear Parent/Carer,

We are delighted at how well all of the children have settled into Reception so far. We are excited to share lots of new experiences with them and get to know them much better over the next coming weeks. Our theme for this half term is 'I wonder...what is special to us'

#### **Maths**

We are getting to know what the children can do well already and what their next steps are. We will be following White Rose Mastery maths, which encourages children to get a deeper understanding of number, shape and patterns. We will begin learning how to match and sort different numbers and objects. We will also be comparing amounts and exploring patterns.

#### Literacy

We will be reading a range of books to support our theme 'I wonder what is special to us'. We will share both fiction and non-fiction books to help us learn about different families, cultures, likes, dislikes and many other ways we are all unique and special. In Writing, children will continue to practise writing their names, making sure the letters are formed correctly and are in the right order. Children will start to write the sounds that they can hear in words and begin to write some tricky words. We will start our phonics teaching this half term by focusing on the sounds: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, o, c, k, ck, e, u

#### **Exploring Art and Design**

We will be creating artwork based on our interests and fascinations. The children will construct using a range of materials and will explore different skills such as joining, cutting and mixing colours.

# I wonder what is special to us

#### Communication and Language

We will develop the ability to listen during carpet time sessions and learn to answer questions about what they have heard. The children will begin to make predictions about what might happen next in a story.

#### **Physical Development**

We will focus on self-help skills using our fine motor skills, such as fastening coats and buttons. We will be doing crafts to challenge our cutting skills and outside we will be building obstacle courses to test our balance and coordination.

#### **Understanding the World**

The children will talk about different celebrations and traditions. We will learn how people live their lives differently and talk about festivals.

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be learning how to behave safely in a classroom with all of our new friends. The children will learn how to play kindly, follow instructions and talk about their feelings.

#### **Our Place in Our World**

We will be learning about how we live our lives and how this is the same and/or different to our friends.

#### **Aspiring Entrepreneurs**

We will continue to reflect on our work to ensure that we are able to improve it and see how we can make it even better.

#### **Healthy and Happy Living**

We will share our ideas in a range of different and imaginative ways. Allowing children to have a voice with their learning.

#### **Inquisitive Investigators**

We will encourage children to talk about what they see and hear and to make comments and ask questions.
