We have plenty of exciting learning opportunities throughout the Spring Term and we are all looking forward to developing our skills over the next six weeks!

English

Throughout the term, children will continue to focus on daily handwriting, reading and phonics.

We will be writing a setting description based on our class story 'Dougal the Deep-Sea Diver using all our knowledge from our visit to The Deep. From this we will be developing sentence structure, including expanded noun phrases and looking at word classes. We will also be writing our own diaries based on the book.

Maths


Multiplication and Division — children have been consolidating their understanding of multiplication and division. Please continue to practice times tables at home. Measurement — throughout the half term, children will explore different measures including length, height, mass, capacity and temperature. Exploring these at home practically will help greatly in developing the childrens understanding.

Children will continue to consolidate and practise calculations for the four operations and should access TTRS regularly.

Art

In **Art,** children will explore different styles of portraits and use these to create self-portraits by imitating the styles of both realism and surrealism.

Children will have the opportunity to use different media to create portraits, including pastels, paints and collage.



Science 'Plants'

In Science we will continuing to study Plants. We will recap on what plants need to grow and use this when we grow our own plants from seeds to test which grow the best. We will consider the role plants play in our lives including growing plants for food and agriculture and plant products in the home.

History

We will be learning about British Monarchs.
Looking at William the Conquerors reign from 1066 onwards, how King John made himself very unpopular as monarch and why King Henry VIII married so many times. This unit also teaches who Queen Anne was, what Queen Victoria achieved during her reign and looks at the role of the British monarchy today.

PE/PSHE

P.E will be training with the Hunslet rugby coach.

PSHE will explore how to be safe with medicines and where medicines come from, including work on strangers we trust and strangers we do not.

Computing

In Computing, children will look at data handling and begin to make pictograms.

This will develop their digital literacy skills as part of our Maths learning.

The children will collect their own data and then interpret this into a pictogram?

Our Place in 'Our World.

In British Values lessons, children will learn about similarities and differences between them and others.

Aspiring Entrepreneurs

In Science, children will look at plants and the conditions these need to grow.

We will hold class discussions and debates about farming and food production around the world.

Healthy and Happy Living

In PSHE children will learn about how medicines keep us healthy and the importance of using them safely.

Inquisitive Investigators

As Inquisitive Investigators, the children will carry out investigations into the perfect conditions for plants to grow and record the results. Children will then make generalisations to find what plants need.

Important information for children in school:

- Our PE lessons will take place every Tuesday and children should come to school in their PE kits. This must include a plain white top, plain black shorts/jogging bottoms and sensible trainers that they can exercise in. Children may wear a plain black hoody or fleece if the weather is cold, but this should be plain and unbranded.
- Please bring your child's book bag to school every day so that we can read with children daily. Completed books will be changed on Friday ready to be sent home for the weekend. Any time you read with your child, please record it on the Boom Reader App.
- Spelling tests and Times Table Rock Stars awards will be on a Friday.
- Children should access TTRS and Spelling Shed as regularly as possible at home to support learning in school.
